

Codes of Conduct for the State/National Player

1. Abide by rules of the State. Adhere to the rules of the PAA and amendments set down by your State Association.
2. A high standard of Conduct is expected at all times and as such swearing and displays of bad temper will not be tolerated (on and off the field) under any circumstances. Verbal abuse of officials or other players is prejudicial and will be dealt with within the constitution.
3. All players place themselves under direct control of State Team Manager/State Team Coach during the period of any official State/National tour, training or competition.
4. Players must comply with uniform dress code requirements as set by their State.
5. Acknowledge those in leadership positions.
6. Respect umpires and officials.
7. Players must be an ambassador for Polocrosse at all times.
8. Work equally hard for yourself and for your team. Your team's performance will benefit and so will you.
9. Be a good sports person. Acknowledge all good players, whether in your team or the opposing side.
10. The consumption of alcohol is not encouraged by seniors and will not be tolerated by juniors at any stage. Non-prescribed, illegal drugs are forbidden at all times.
11. Players must attempt to maintain themselves in peak mental and physical condition during training and competition.
12. Ignore as much as possible any isolated incidents of unsporting Conduct you might encounter. Highlighting such Conduct is unproductive and unsporting.
13. Any illness or injury (player or horse) must be reported to the team coach and/or manager as soon as possible.
14. Players must attend all training sessions as requested by the coach.
15. Players must abide by training programs set by the team coach.
16. Never argue with an umpire or an official. If you disagree, ask your captain or coach to approach the official during a break or after the game.
17. All rules of venues being used by the State team and regulations of the host organisation must be adhered to.
18. If any party breaches this code of Conduct, then such breach may lead to either temporary or permanent expulsion from the team.
19. Players must take responsibility for the fitness, care and general well being of the horse at all times.
20. Care and consideration must be shown to your team mates and the opposition horses at all times.
21. Carry out any veterinary approved treatments necessary prior to re-entering WA as advised by your team coach or manager.
